Dear Mr. Castro:

Thank you for your courtesy and cooperation, at your office last Friday, November 10, 2000. We are still interested in trying to reach an amicable resolution of this matter; however, there are going to be some obstacles which must be overcome first.

First, as Ken Leggett and myself told you, in your office, there appears to have been some serious misappropriation of funds by your client, unless he can come up with corresponding receipts for well over \$150,000.00 indicating to the contrary. Additionally, the sale of the Williamson fractional interest appears to have been completely unnecessary, but for the aforementioned misappropriation of funds.

We would propose that your client enter into an agreed injunction, which we will prepare, prohibiting either party from the usual conduct in order to preserve what is left of the estate. Obviously, if an emergency arises you could contact us and we would contact our client to resolve issues which may develop down the road. In the meantime please furnish the accounting for 1997, 1998, 1999 and 2000, which you stated you would do. If your client will not agree to the injunction we will be forced to make application to the Court for same.

We understand that you have inherited this case from your previous partner, and we are doing everything we can to try to get into a position where we can try to negotiate a settlement but without more information that will be impossible. We will avoid formal discovery requests if that will make your life easier, and we will travel to Hamlin if that will be easier on you.

As it stands, it appears that your client wants to try to settle this matter. The only remaining question is what will it take to settle the matter and to make my client whole. I need a deadline

by which you propose to furnish us with a complete accounting for 1997, 1998, 1999 and 2000. I will also need a deadline by which your client intends to furnish receipts. I am confident that we can resolve these issues without resorting to the Court. I look forward to hearing from you at your earliest convenience on this matter.

AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF MOTION FOR SUMMARY JUDGMENT

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, personally appeared ISAAC M. CASTRO, who being duly sworn, deposed as follows:

"My name is ISAAC M. CASTRO. I am at least 18 years of age and of sound mind. I am personally acquainted with the facts alleged herein.

"Bob Denison has filed many lawsuits, petitions, applications, and/or motions against John Wayne Denison beginning on February 4, 1998, by the filing of an Application to Set Aside Order Probating Will in Cause No. 1293 in the County Court of Stonewall County, Texas. That case was transferred to the 39th District Court of Stonewall County, Texas, under Cause No. 4222. This will contest was eventually denied by the trial court in a summary judgment on May 24, 1999. Bob Denison appealed the summary judgment, and the Eastland Court of Appeals affirmed and issued its mandate on September 13, 2001. Bob Denison filed other applications and motions in Cause No. 1293. However, he also filed a suit to remove executor in Cause No. 1024 in the County Court of Stonewall County, Texas. This case was dismissed for want of jurisdiction on February 18, 2002. On September 16, 2004, the Eastland Court of Appeals denied Bob Denison's Petition for Writ of Mandamus arising out of Cause No. 1293. On January 14, 2005, the Texas Supreme likewise denied Bob Denison's Petition for Writ of Mandamus. Since the initial will contest suit was filed, Bob Denison has been in continuous litigation against his brother, John Wayne Denison, requiring the Estate of Ida Baldwin Denison, Deceased, to expend hundreds of thousands of dollars. Bob Denison

testified during his deposition on July 29, 2008, that he had expended approximately \$750,000.00 in attorneys' fees and related litigation expenses since he filed the will contest case, including essentially all of the mineral and royalty income he has received. Bob Denison has employed at least eight lawyers throughout the years, and two years ago he re-employed Travis Ware and Susie Shay, who represented him from at least the early part of 2000 until the fall of 2002.

"Bob Denison approved the special use valuation election in Form 706, the Estate Tax Return for the Estate of Ida Baldwin Denision, Deceased.


